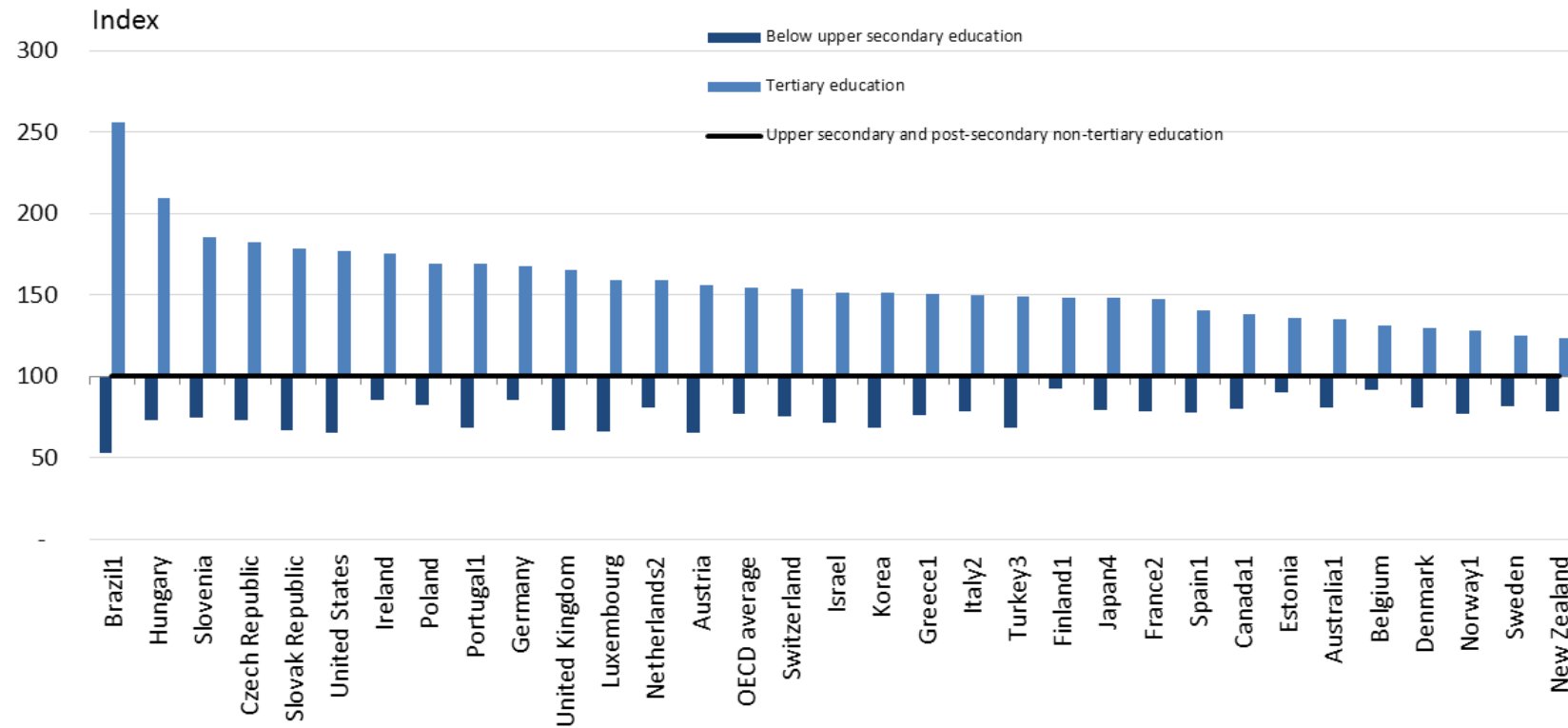


**Chart A8.1. Relative earnings from employment among 25-64 year-olds, by level of educational attainment (2010 or latest available year)**

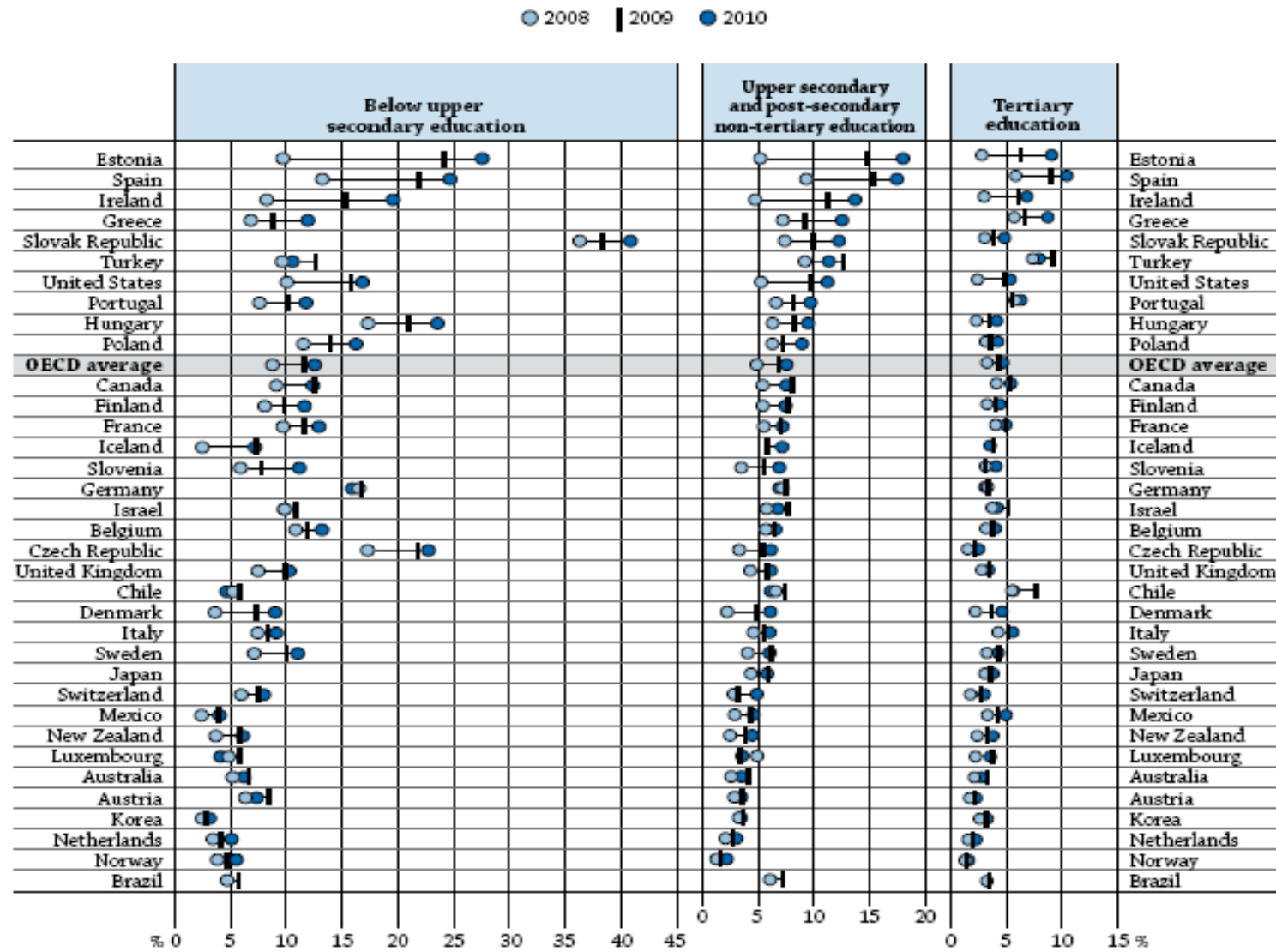

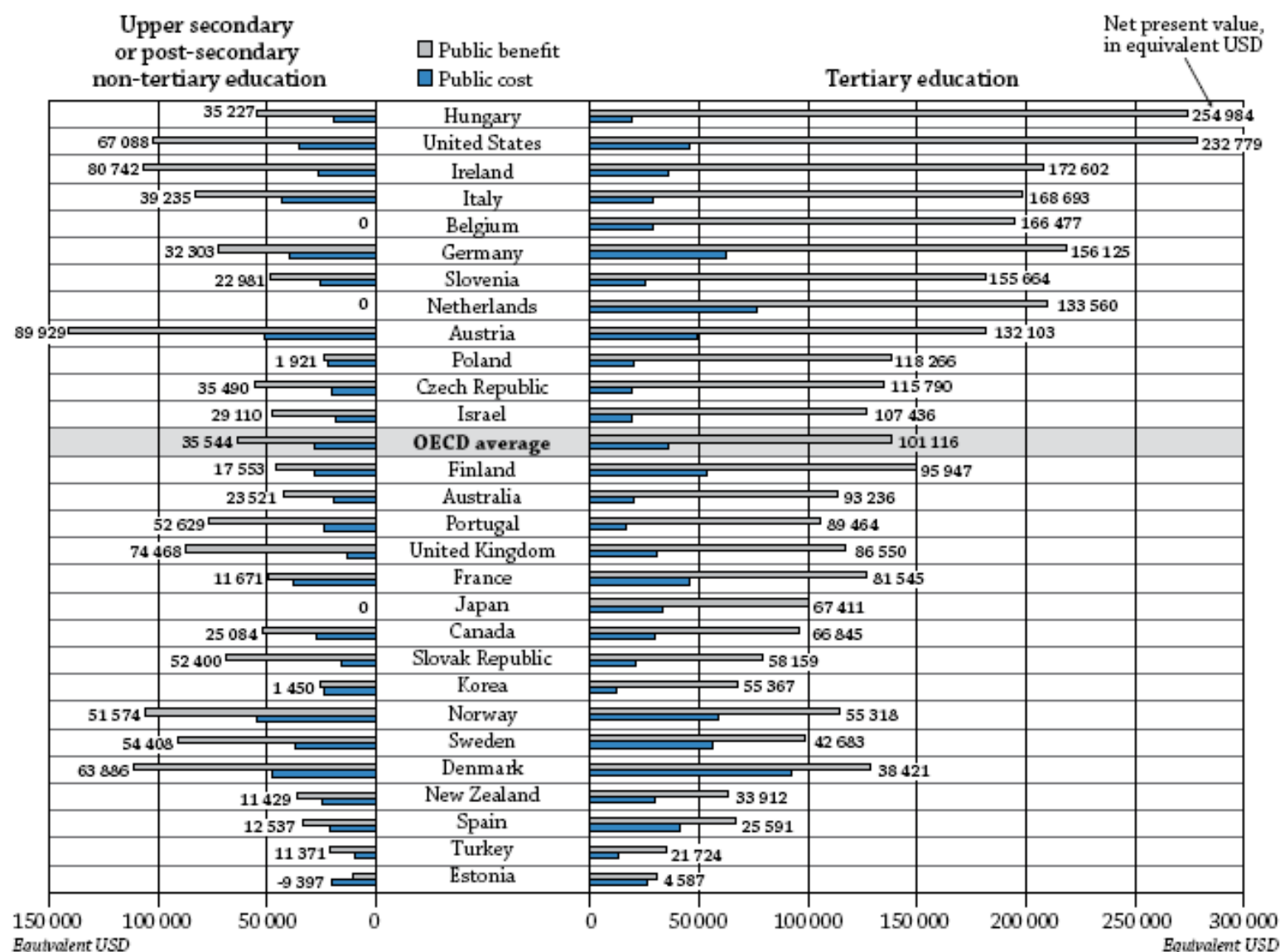

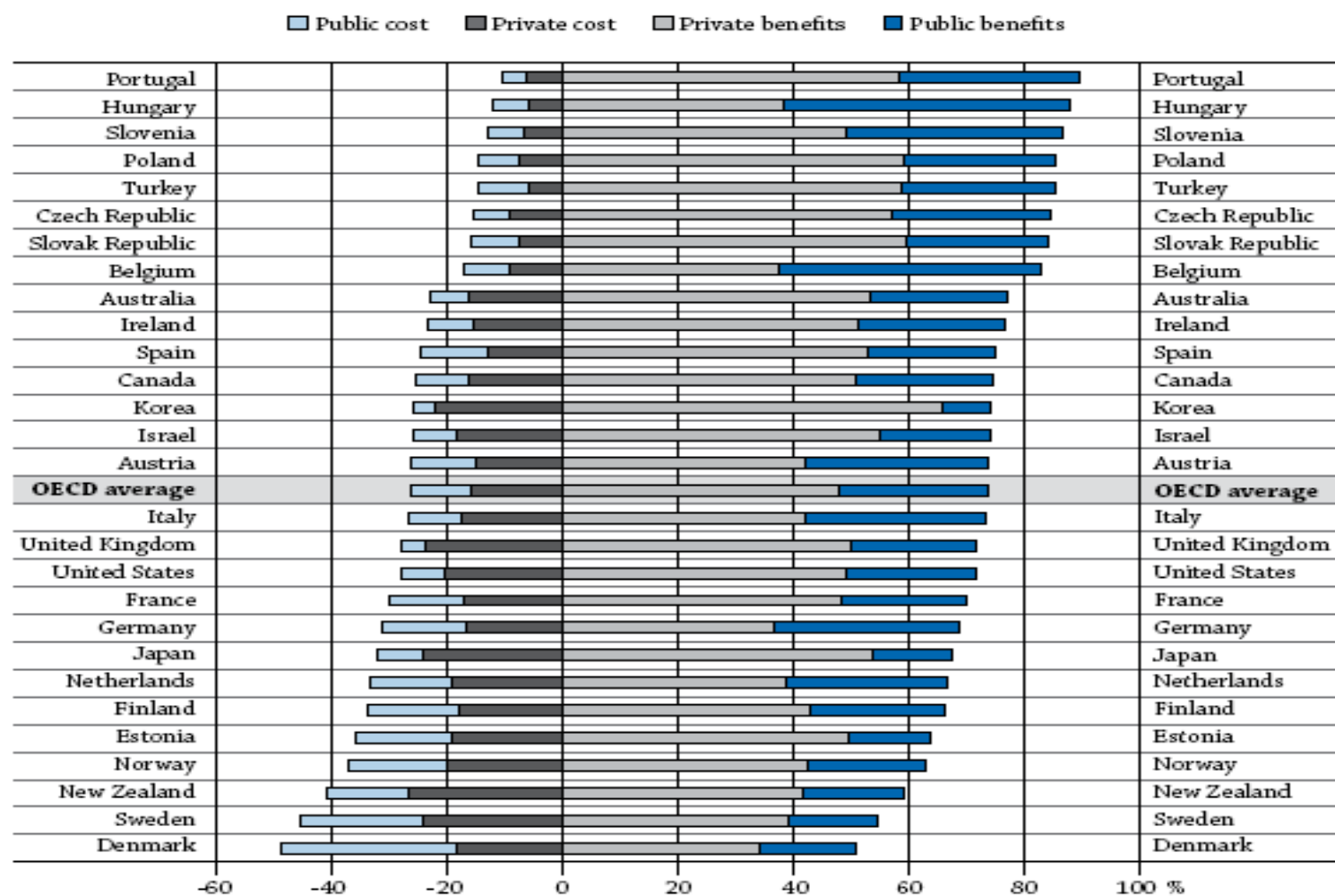
**Chart A7.2. Unemployment rates of 25-64 year-olds, by educational attainment level (2008, 2009 and 2010)**



**Chart A9.5. Public cost and benefits for a man obtaining upper secondary or post-secondary non-tertiary education and tertiary education (2008 or latest available year)**

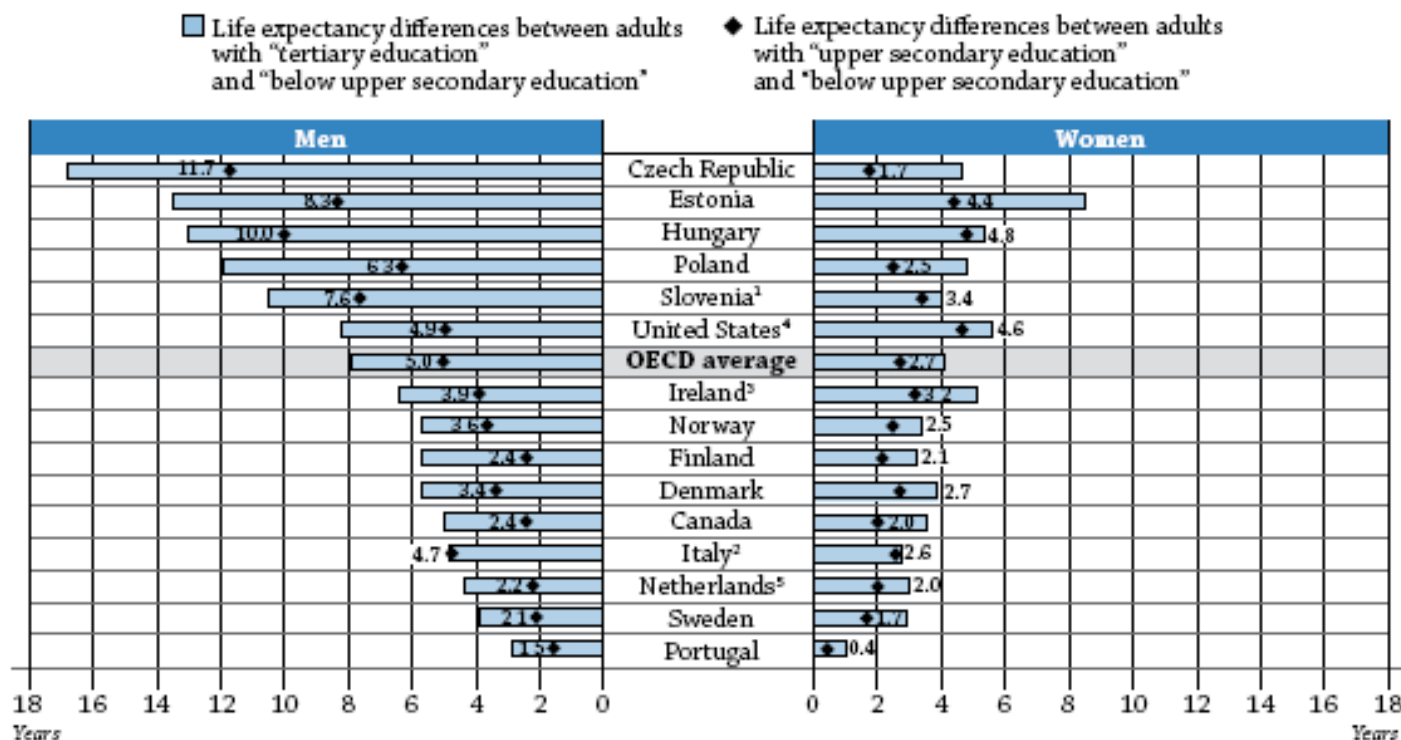
